

COMMUNITY TEAMWORKS 2008 Impact Summary

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25,000 VOLUNTEERS

In 2008, 45 Goldman Sachs offices partnered with 780 nonprofit Community Partners worldwide. Over 25,000 Goldman Sachs people joined with family and friends to contribute over 146,800 hours to the communities where we work and live. Volunteers participated in 1,761 projects and assisted 9,340 infants, 65,163 children, 26,075 adolescents, 31,398 adults, 13,470 elderly, 36,179 persons with disabilities/special needs and 16,265 animals; volunteered at 167 community events; painted 155 murals, 346 rooms and 51 community buildings; renovated 89 rooms; renovated and helped build 89 community buildings/homes and 24 playgrounds; built 11 homes with Habitat for Humanity; beautified 16 beaches and 85 parks; planted 258 gardens, 2,264 trees and 48,822 flowers; served 17,913 meals; packaged 316,534 lbs. of food; delivered 27,140 meals; constructed 5,712 yards of fencing; and beautified 610 acres and 9 miles of land.

Assisted 40 children, 60 adolescents and 40 persons with disabilities/special needs; helped build 1 home with Habitat for Humanity.

Bangalore

Assisted 1,434 children, 180 adolescents, 97 adults, 421 elderly, 160 persons with disabilities/special needs and 150 animals; volunteered at 2 community events; painted 12 murals, 25 rooms and 5 community buildings; renovated 13 rooms and 3 community buildings; built 8 homes with Habitat for Humanity; planted 6 gardens, 68 trees and 494 flowers; served 20 meals; painted 49 dog kennels and 8 bird cages; contributed 3 days to nonprofit business development; converted 5 sighted books into Braille; bound 1,000 books for persons with disabilities/special needs.

Assisted 581 children, 50 adolescents, 125 adults, 6 elderly, 111 persons with disabilities/special needs and

8 animals; volunteered at 2 community events; painted 2 murals; planted 30 trees; loaded one truck of disaster relief goods for shipment to the Sichuan Earthquake zone.

Boston

Assisted 200 children and 60 adolescents; painted 1 mural, 3 rooms and 1 community building; beautified 1 beach and 2 parks; planted 2 gardens, 40 trees and 50 flowers; beautified 7 acres of land.

Buenos Aires

Assisted 50 children, 50 adolescents and 25 adults; volunteered at 1 community event.

Cayman Islands

Assisted 15 animals; painted 1 community building; beautified 1 beach and 2 parks; planted 3 gardens; beautified 3 acres of land; removed 500 lbs. of trash from the Grand Cayman Shoreline.

Chicago

Assisted 1,956 children, 368 adolescents, 4,285 adults, 65 elderly, 900 persons with disabilities/special needs and 930 animals; volunteered at 2 community events; painted 10 murals, 35 rooms and 1 community

building; renovated 3 playgrounds and 18 rooms; helped build 2 homes with Habitat for Humanity; beautified 6 parks; planted 5 trees and 40 flowers; served 40 meals; packaged 5,828 lbs. of food; beautified 4 acres of land; built 4 picnic tables and 1 storage shed.

Assisted 50 adolescents, 4 adults and 90 persons with disabilities/special needs; volunteered at 2 community events; constructed 70 yards of fencing; beautified 1 acre of land.

Renovated 4 rooms; planted 1 garden and 60 flowers.

Frankfurt

Assisted 410 children, 50 adolescents, 342 adults, 210 elderly, 115 persons with disabilities/special needs and 150 animals; volunteered at 1 community event; renovated 1 playground; built 2 playgrounds; planted 2 gardens and 180 flowers; served 882 meals; packaged 45 lbs. of food.

Geneva

Assisted 16 children, 113 adults, 21 elderly and 73 persons with disabilities/special needs; volunteered at 1 community event.

Hong Kong

Assisted 156 infants, 123 children, 549 adolescents, 80 adults, 229 elderly, 411 persons with disabilities/special needs and 40 animals; volunteered at 3 community events; painted 3 murals, 1 room and 6 benches; beautified 1 beach; planted 75 trees; served 320 meals; delivered 124 meals; loaded 4 forty-foot containers (1 to Sichuan Earthquake zone, 1 to Cambodia, 1 to DR Congo and 1 to Kazakhstan) and packed 97 boxes for disaster relief and humanitarian aid.

Assisted 110 children; volunteered at 3 community events; helped build 1 home with Habitat for Humanity.

Johannesburg

Assisted 98 elderly; planted 1 garden; served 140 meals.

Labuan–Malaysia

Assisted 240 adolescents.

London

Assisted 765 children, 453 adolescents, 416 adults, 316 elderly and 823 persons with disabilities/special needs; volunteered at 26 community events; painted 3 murals, 141 rooms, and 13 community buildings; renovated 4 playgrounds; built 1 playground; beautified 7 parks; planted 27 gardens, 10 trees and 5,595 flowers; served 1,120 meals; packaged 2,640 lbs. of food; delivered 1,800 meals; constructed 4,649 yards of fencing; beautified 39 acres and 5 miles of land; contributed 12 days to nonprofit business development; built 50 tree guards; assembled 68,913 Remembrance Poppies; distributed over 35,000 goody bags at the London Marathon; built 2 bridges and a pond dipping platform; beautified 2 river banks; constructed 40 meters of boardwalk.

Assisted 100 children; painted 1 community building; renovated 22 rooms; beautified 1 beach; planted 1 garden and 40 flowers; served 250 meals; beautified 1 acre of land.

Madrid

Assisted 25 children and 12 animals; beautified 218 yards of land at an animal rescue shelter.

Helped build 2 homes with Habitat for Humanity; served 500 meals.

Milan

Assisted 13 adults and 27 persons with disabilities/special needs; served 660 meals.

Assisted 2,544 infants, 37,901 children, 18,258 adolescents, 17,019 adults, 6,240 elderly, 29,976 persons with disabilities/special needs and 13,171 animals; volunteered at 101 community events; painted 114 murals, 137 rooms and 22 community buildings; renovated 25 rooms, 16 community buildings and 13 playgrounds; helped build 50 community buildings/homes and built 3 homes with Habitat for Humanity; built 4 playgrounds; beautified 9 beaches and 55 parks; planted 201 gardens, 1,920 trees and 41,341 flowers; served 7,901 meals; packaged 239,811 lbs. of food; delivered 24,815 meals; constructed 983 yards of fencing; beautified 553 acres and 4 miles of land; painted 1 skating rink; restored 1 mosaic; removed 1 truckload of garbage from the Hackensack riverbanks by canoe; distributed 52 computers to families in East Harlem; accompanied 16 visually impaired youth on a tandem bike ride in Central Park.
