Dominic is chief markets economist and co-head of both Macro Research in the Americas and Global Economics Research. Dominic's past work covers a wide range of areas, including the creation of the Goldman Sachs Global Leading Indicator, the key reports on the future of the BRICs and N-11, and the group's Wavefront tools for analyzing equity markets. He joined Goldman Sachs in 2000 as a member of the Asian Economics Group in Hong Kong before moving to New York to work as a global economist. Dominic was named managing director in 2004 and partner in 2008.

Prior to joining the firm, Dominic worked as a consultant on Asia Pacific economic policy issues.

1995. He also earned a master's degree in public policy from the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University and a PhD in Economics from the Australian National University.
