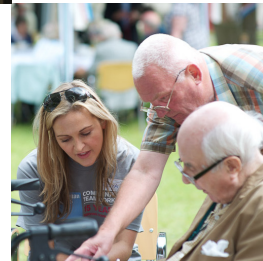


COMMUNITY TEAMWORKS

In 2011, 43 Goldman Sachs offices partnered with 905 nonprofit Community Partners worldwide. Over 26,500 Goldman Sachs people joined with family and friends to contribute over 150,000 hours to the communities where we work and live.

15 YEARS SERVING COMMUNITIES



Volunteers participated in 2,035 projects and assisted 12,175 infants, 44,148 children, 13,641 adolescents, 22,397 adults, 6,383 elderly and 10,087 persons with disabilities/special needs; volunteered at 227 community events; painted 84 murals, 281 rooms and 45 community buildings; renovated 140 community rooms; built 4 homes with Habitat for Humanity; renovated and helped build 137 community buildings/homes and 35 playgrounds; constructed 9,141 yards of fencing; cared for 9,507 animals; beautified 51 beaches, 79 parks, 997 acres of outdoor space and 29 miles of land; planted 266 gardens, 2,552 trees and 60,678 flowers; packaged 41,126 lbs. of food; served 81,548 meals; delivered 14,134 meals.

Renovated 7 community rooms; renovated and helped build 4 community buildings/homes and 1 playground; constructed 10 yards of fencing; beautified 1 acre of outdoor space; planted 10 gardens and 75 flowers; packaged 13,055 lbs. of food; served 170 meals.

Assisted 2,048 infants, 27,684 children, 6,117 adolescents, 11,476 adults, 3,153 elderly and 3,544 persons with disabilities/special needs; volunteered at 95 community events; painted 39 murals, 208 rooms and 21 community buildings; renovated 108 community rooms; built 4 homes with Habitat for Humanity; renovated and helped build 66 community buildings/homes and 12 playgrounds; constructed 1,123 yards of fencing; cared for 6,787 animals; beautified 33 beaches, 55 parks, 390 acres of outdoor space and 12 miles of land; planted 191 gardens and 1 marsh, 1,380 trees and 37,537 flowers; packaged 23,486 lbs. of food; served 58,841 meals; delivered 6,654 meals; sorted 15,500 donated eyeglasses; wired a school's computer network; collected and removed 12,478 pieces of trash from public spaces; restored and painted 8 boats; sorted and packed 20,400 books; painted 1,200 benches; assembled 2,000 battery packs for the Light the Night walk; packed 560 book bags for underserved students; provided business strategy advice to 35 small business owners; constructed 200 yards of hiking trail; surveyed and accounted for 2 endangered species in a 5 sq mile area; built 100 bikes for children of U.S. soldiers.
