COMMUNITY TEAMWORKS Impact Summary

In partnership with 619 nonprofit community partners worldwide, over 18,000 Goldman Sachs people joined with family and friends to contribute 108,342 hours to the communities where we work and live. Volunteers participated in 1,422 projects and assisted 2,285 infants, 22,708 children, 10,937 adolescents, 23,703 adults, 10,053 elderly, 65,839 persons with disabilities/special needs and 6,085 animals; painted 58 murals, 291 rooms and 41 community buildings; renovated and helped build 84 community buildings/homes and 33 playgrounds; built 4 homes with Habitat for Humanity; beautified 15 beaches; planted 409 gardens, 1,008 trees and 67,904 flowers; served 11,576 meals; packaged 183,422 lbs. of food; delivered 11,422 meals and beautified 55 miles and 4,156 acres of land.

Assisted 20 children, 30 adolescents and 20 animals; painted 10 murals.

Assisted 630 children, 20 adolescents, 58 adults, 40 elderly, 180 persons with disabilities/special needs and 75 animals; painted 3 murals, 5 rooms and 4 community buildings; renovated 3 community buildings and 1 playground; planted 2 gardens, 145 trees and 460 flowers; served 85 meals; supplied school notebooks to 30 students and 70 mattresses to children.

Assisted 50 children and 1 adult; painted 5 rooms; beautified 1 beach.

CHICAGO

Assisted 1,005 children, 115 adolescents, 1,155 adults, 67 elderly, 1,010 persons with disabilities/special needs and 400 animals; volunteered at 1 community event; painted 18 rooms; renovated 3 community buildings; planted 300 flowers; packaged 4,000 lbs. of food; beautified 10 acres of land.

Assisted 997 children, 196 adolescents, 807 adults, 358 elderly and 1,177 persons with disabilities/special needs; volunteered at 14 community events; painted 3 murals, 28 rooms and 9 community buildings; renovated 1 community building and 3 playgrounds; built 3 playgrounds; planted 27 gardens, 62 trees and 1,917 flowers; served 1,440 meals; beautified 1,720 acres of land; dedicated 12 days to nonprofit business development; distributed 30,000 goodie bags at the London Marathon; installed 10 pedestrian gates; constructed 860 meters of fencing and 50 meters of tunnels; rebuilt 30 meters of a ha-ha wall; constructed 50 wire cages for pond wildlife and 1 otter home; built 2 bridges, 1 bird hide and 1 pond dipping platform; painted a total of 31 signs, gates and fences and 18 stables; assembled 79,608 "Remembrance Poppies".

Assisted 1,863 infants, 14,828 children, 7,810 adolescents, 18,734 adults, 7,743 elderly, 58,915 persons with disabilities/special needs and 5,112 animals; volunteered at 34 community events; painted 32 murals, 208 rooms and 23 community buildings; renovated 8 community buildings and 23 playgrounds; helped build 59 community buildings/homes; built 3 homes with Habitat for Humanity; beautified 7 beaches and 5 parks; planted 370 gardens, 613 trees and 64,817 flowers; served 4,853 meals; packaged 116,275 lbs. of food; delivered 11,290 meals; beautified 12 miles and 395 acres of land; sorted 12,000 and tested 500 pairs of glasses; assembled and packaged 20 school chests with educational materials for a Navajo settlement in Arizona; hand-built 8 traditional wooden oars; gift wrapped 1,000 toys; cleaned 1 monument; created 5 bird houses and 8 reptile brush piles; renovated 2 historic ships; helped continue the revitalization of downtown Manhattan by collecting data for a downtown directory; beautified the banks of the Hackensack River and removed 26,801 pieces of litter and debris from the New Jersey shore.

Assisted 40 infants, 300 children, 43 adolescents, 74 adults, 20 elderly, 1,118 persons with disabilities/special needs and 88 animals; planted 2 gardens; packaged 1,652 lbs. of food; beautified 2,000 acres of land, 1 riverbank, 1 park and 1 hiking trail; 3 historical sites; created 3 grasslands for rabbits to be able to live comfortably; made 426 red and 458 rainbow ribbons to raise HIV awareness, 80 bags for children with disabilities/special needs in Myanmar, 30 hand-made toys for children with disabilities/special needs, 2,400 lunch boxes and 4,800 rice balls for the homeless; recorded 1 novel for students at a school for the blind; provided career mentoring for 6 students at a children's home and 25 domestic violence survivors; collected and sorted 105 business suits for men and women in need; designed and painted 1 playground.
