IMPACT SUMMARY

In 2007, 43 Goldman Sachs offices partnered with 726 nonprofit Community Partners worldwide. Over 20,900 Goldman Sachs people joined with family and friends to contribute 128,780 hours to the communities where we work and live. Volunteers participated in 1,650 projects and assisted 3,397 infants, 50,899 children, 14,105 adolescents, 14,396 adults, 7,778 elderly, 39,475 persons with disabilities/special needs, and 9,585 animals; volunteered at 86 community events; painted 75 murals, 369 rooms and 45 community buildings; renovated 107 rooms, renovated and helped build 87 community building/homes and 42 playgrounds; built 6 homes with Habitat for Humanity; beautified 37 beaches and 76 parks; planted 301 gardens, 828 trees and 54,110 flowers; served 13,137 meals; packaged 334,970 lbs. of food; delivered 2,739 meals; constructed 3,628 yards of fencing and beautified 1,515 acres and 40 miles of land.
