Chairman of Goldman Sachs Asia Pacific



Mark is a vice chairman of The Goldman Sachs Group, Inc. and chairman of Goldman Sachs Asia Pacific. He is a member of the Management Committee, on which he first served from 1999, when the firm went public, until his retirement in 2001. Mark rejoined the firm in June 2012 and is based in Beijing.

Mark first joined Goldman Sachs in 1979 in the Investment Banking Division. He spent 17 years in various positions in New York and in 1997 he relocated to Tokyo to become president of Goldman Sachs Japan. In 1999, Mark was appointed chairman of Goldman Sachs Asia. He became a partner in 1988.

Prior to rejoining the firm, Mark was the chairman of MissionPoint Capital Partners, an investment firm he co-founded which invested in clean energy technology. He previously served as president and chief executive officer of Soros Fund Management.

Mark serves as a director on the boards of SoftBank Corp. and the US-China

Business Council, and as a member of the Advisory Council of the Bai Xian Asia Institute. He is a trustee of New York-Presbyterian Hospital and a member of its Executive Committee. Mark is also a member of the Executive Committee of the Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital of New York-Presbyterian. He serves as an honorary trustee at Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH), and on the Board of Directors of the Ragon Institute of MGH, MIT and Harvard University. Much of Mark's philanthropy at Harvard and MGH has been devoted to global health issues and biomedical research. He is on the Boards of Dean's Advisors at Harvard College, Harvard Business School, the Harvard Kennedy School and the Harvard School of Public Health.

Mark earned an MBA, an MPP and a BA from Harvard University.
